Dayton Parks

Central Park

- 40 acre park behind City Hall
- Playground equipment, picnic tables, picnic shelter, trails, basketball court, 4 ball fields, restrooms, parking lot, soccer/football field, skating rink, warming house

Cloquet Overlook Park

- 16 acre park overlooking Mississippi River
- Playground equipment, picnic tables, paved trails, benches, parking, bbq grills, shelter, restroom facilities

Diamond Lake Diamonds

- 2 baseball fields and parking lot

Donahue Dells Park

- 2 acre neighborhood park with playground equipment and benches

Leathers Park

- 2.5 acre park with ball fields and parking

Highland Park

- 3 acre wooded park and pond

Goodin Park

- 5 acre wooded park located along Mississippi River with picnic tables, trails and parking, restroom facilities

Orchard Park

- 5 acre natural park and pond

McNeil Park

- 3 acre park with ball field, bleachers, scoreboard, playground, picnic tables, parking

Mississippi River Park

- Half-acre park located on Mississippi River in the Historic Village with bench and grill

Riversbend Park

- 3 ½ acre neighborhood park with playground equipment, picnic tables and a ball field

Wildwood Springs Park

- 10 acre natural park with Mississippi River frontage
